Comparing Religions



Knowledge Students are introduced to major world religions. They explore key beliefs, worship practices, founders, sacred texts, and values. They examine similarities and differences between traditions and learn why religion matters to people. Pupils compare and contrast information, identify patterns, and write structured explanations using key terminology accurately.

Christianity: Beliefs & Teachings




Knowledge

Students study Christian beliefs about God, the Trinity, Jesus, salvation, sin, and life after death. They explore biblical teachings such as parables and the miracles of Jesus to see how beliefs shape Christian living.

Skill

Students interpret religious teachings, explain how beliefs influence actions, and use scripture to support their viewpoints in writing.

The Hindu Dharma



Knowledge

Students explore central Hindu concepts such as dharma, karma, samsara, moksha, and the role of deities. They study sacred stories, festivals, and the importance of family and community in Hindu life.

Skill

Students interpret symbolic ideas, explain complex religious concepts clearly, and link beliefs to lifestyle and behaviour.

Religious Celebrations




Knowledge

Students investigate major religious festivals such as Easter, Diwali, Holi, Ramadan, Eid, Passover, and Vaisakhi. They explore how celebrations express beliefs and strengthen community.

Skill

Students compare celebrations, present ideas clearly, debate perspectives, and explain how rituals reflect deeper religious meanings.

Islamic Beliefs



Knowledge

Students study core Islamic beliefs including Tawhid, angels, prophets, holy books, judgement, and the role of Muhammad. They explore how these beliefs are expressed through the Shahadah and daily practice.

Skill

Students analyse key beliefs, explain how these shape Muslim identity, and use Qur'anic evidence in written explanations.

Islamic Teachings



Knowledge

Students examine Islamic moral teachings such as the Five Pillars, charity, justice, equality, and compassion. They study Qur'anic passages and Hadith to understand guidance on ethical issues.

Skill

Students apply teachings to real-life scenarios, evaluate different Islamic viewpoints, and construct balanced arguments using religious evidence.
