Principal's Welcome

Dear Parents / Carers

The theme of the week has been all about rewards. We want to celebrate our students and encourage them to be proud of their talents and to recognise and celebrate in their own success and that of others. 100 students across all Year groups received ASPIRE certificates this week for demonstrating our school values day-in, day-out. These students have received the most positive points from their teachers since September. 5 students received the Principal's Award, which goes to a single student in each year group, so a massive well done to these students, as these certificates are very special.

We are also celebrating as a school, as we received the Artsmark award this week, recognising our commitment to ensuring high quality arts and cultural education. This is an excellent award and I am very proud of the teachers, particularly Mrs Whittle, who worked hard to achieve it for the students at West Craven High School.

Our Year 11 students are preparing for their mock exams, which are the first week back; the first exams are on Tuesday 11th November. Students will complete full papers in most of their subjects based on what they have learned so far since Year 10. We have given students revision guides and topic lists and prepared them with practice questions and revision techniques. The two week holiday is a perfect opportunity to revise those Year 10 knowledge gaps. The Year 11 students need some time to relax and see friends and family, and recharge so they are ready to come back in November to tackle the half term ahead. However, it is also a really important year for the GCSE students this year, so they should spend some of this time using the revision techniques they have been taught.

We have had some more further sporting success this week with the Year 7 Football teams both beating Marsden Heights comfortably with a 5-1 and 11-3 win. Staying with the football theme, 5 fantastic students had a surprise trip to Turf Moor to enjoy a stadium tour and meet the players. They were a credit to the school and their families; they represented their school with pride!

YEAR 11 REVISION INFORMATION


Year 11 Half-Term Revision Programme

CONSULTATION ADMISSIONS ARRANGEMENTS

Consultation on Admission Arrangements for 2027–2028


Pendle Education Trust, as the admissions authority for Colne Primet Academy and West Craven High School, is beginning a consultation on admission arrangements for the 2027–2028 academic year.

Under the Department for Education’s School Admission Code, all admission authorities must consult on their arrangements whenever changes are proposed, or at least once every seven years. This ensures the process remains open, transparent, and gives parents and the community the chance to share their views.

For 2027–2028, the Trust is proposing a change to the Published Admission Number (PAN) for both schools. The PAN sets the maximum number of pupils that can be admitted to each year group.

The consultation will run for a minimum of six weeks, and Pendle Education Trust warmly invites feedback from parents, carers, and other interested parties.

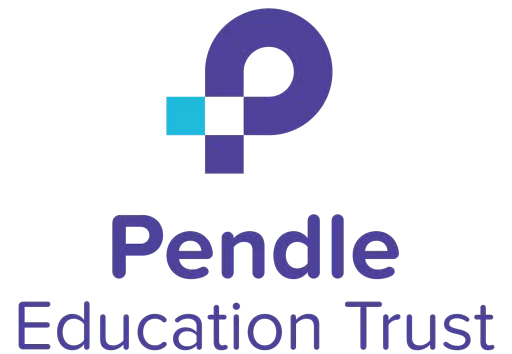

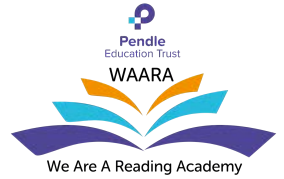

The librarian loves Slaughterhouse Five by Kurt Vonnegut. This book is a literary classic, with anti-war as its main message. Although originally published in 1969, the book's themes are still urgent today. Attempts have been made to ban it in several American schools, but challenges against these bans were successful in the Supreme Court due to infringements to First Amendment rights.



Dylan Thomas was born on October 27th 1914 and died on November 9th 1953 at the age of 39. He lived in Wales and England and travelled to Ireland, Italy the Czech Republic, Iran and America. Though his life was short he created a large body of work including: hundreds of poems, surreal short stories, broadcasts about his childhood, a novel and a play. One of his many poems is produced here:

Do Not Go Gentle Into That Good Night by Dylan Thomas

**Do not go gentle into that good night,
Old age should burn and rave at close of day;
Rage, rage against the dying of the light.**

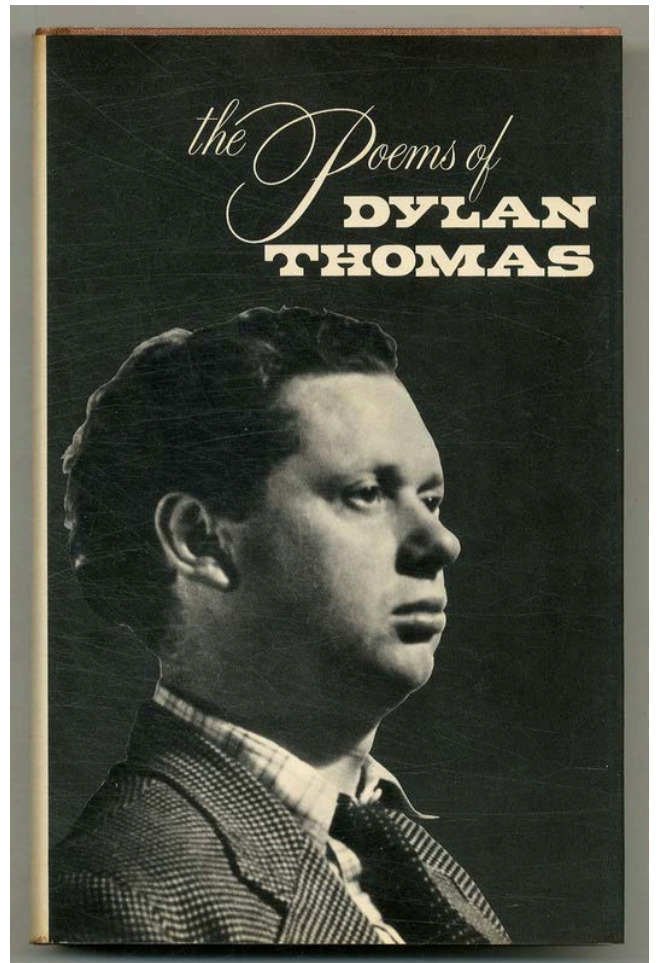
**Though wise men at their end know dark is right,
Because their words had forked no lightning, they
Do not go gentle into that good night.**

**Good men, the last wave by, crying how bright
Their frail deeds might have danced in a green bay,
Rage, rage against the dying of the light.**

**Wild men who caught and sang the sun in flight,
And learn, too late, they grieved it on its way,
Do not go gentle into that good night.**

**Grave men, near death, who see with blinding sight
Blind eyes could blaze like meteors and be gay,
Rage, rage against the dying of the light.**

**And you, my father, there on the sad height,
Curse, bless, me now with your fierce tears, I pray.
Do not go gentle into that good night.
Rage, rage against the dying of the light.**
